Become a Set Designer:

Imagine a theatre has asked you to design a set for a new play. One of the first jobs a Set Designer does is create a mood board, which is a collage or collection of cut-out pictures, and maybe some materials like foil or cotton wool which captures the feel of the play. Ideally, you use 1 sheet of A4 or A3 card.

Look in magazines around your house. Make sure you ask an adult if you can cut pictures from them, then arrange the images in an interesting way on the sheet of card and stick them down with glue.

The play you are designing for is called *The Wandering Cloud* and is about a family of clouds who don't want to rain on a spring day.

Drawing from looking:

Look out of your window or find an object in your house. You'll need a piece of paper and a pencil. Take your time and slowly draw what you see. Really look closely at all the detail of the object.

Once you have finished, colour this in. You can even add a border on the page to frame your drawing!



Easter nests and eggs:

For this you will need a tissue box, colouring pencils or pens, coloured paper or tissue paper, and finally some stickers. Find a tissue box and remove the oval centre flap. Cover this in white paper, this will now be an Easter Egg for you to design and colour.

With the remainder of the tissue box (once it is empty) cover the exterior with white or coloured paper. Fill with scrunched coloured paper. Decorate the outside of the box with stickers and drawings. Securely wedge your Easter Egg in the tissue box and display.

A spring scene:

Can you draw a picture of an outdoor garden in Spring? Think of all the plants and animals that would be living there. You may want to add some rabbits or chicks.

In your garden, draw four hidden Easter Eggs. Ask an adult or a sibling to look at your picture and see if they can spot them.
